It is believed that Benjamin Franklin, one of the great founding fathers of the United States of America, said that "Failing to prepare was preparing to fail."

There is a lot of conventional wisdom in those words when you consider the importance of preparing yourself for an examination, or indeed your car for an MOT. Failing to prepare either yourself or your car adequately will undoubtedly lead to failure!

Lent is a season which is all about preparation. Jesus, following his baptism in the river Jordan, embarked on a season of preparation in the wilderness before commencing his earthly ministry. That preparation consisted of self-denial, examination and reflection:

Self-denial in the form of physical fasting from food;

Examination in that the devil tempted Jesus at his lowest ebb;

Reflection in the sense that each temptation caused Jesus to reflect on God's word and respond to each lie from the devil with truth.

3 times Jesus was tempted by the devil and 3 times he responded from a place of total reliance on the Holy Spirit with truth.

This time of testing ultimately prepared Jesus for the difficult road which lay ahead of him, a road which ended at Calvary.

As followers of Jesus, we all embark on our own journeys with the encouragement that Jesus has walked this path before us and indeed he walks this path with us

through the presence of his Holy Spirit. But how can you and I use this season of Lent more fruitfully to prepare ourselves for the journey which lies before us?

Well I would like to suggest 3 ways in which we can better equip ourselves for the journey ahead:

1. Prayer & Fasting

Prayer is the slender tendon which moves the muscle of omnipotence someone once said. Fasting whilst praying further sharpens our focus on the Lord's presence in seeking His will. Your fasting doesn't need to be for extended periods to be effective and should always be in consultation with medical advice. Perhaps you could fast for 1 day a week during Lent or even deny yourself one meal a day each week as you approach the Lord in prayer. For those who are engaging with the Parish prayer for our "next steps", perhaps this period of fasting could be tied in with our corporate prayer on Tuesday evening at 7.30pm in the Rectory? Perhaps you could use the prayer points on page 8 of our magazine and pray for the work of Tearfund or on page 15 and pray for the work of Fields of Life through the Thrive programme. Perhaps you could come along to the Parish monthly prayer meeting on the first Monday evening of each month at 7.30pm in the Clayton Hall? There are lots of ways in which we can prepare ourselves more fully through prayer.

2. Giving up and giving something

Lent is often seen as a season for giving something up. This isn't a bad thing to do, as long as we don't lose sight of what we are doing and why we are doing it. Why not give up something like sweet stuff, or coffee or chocolate or crisps? Whatever it is we give up, try and estimate how much money we have saved in giving up and then give that money to support the work of Fields of Life through the Thrive programme? There will be an opportunity for us as church family to make our offering on Sunday 30th March when we have a pancake party in the Cathedral Hall at 11am. Folks leaving the 10am service can be part of this, as can those gathering for the service at 11.30am.

3. Reflection on God's Word

During Lent, and beyond, we are encouraging folks to read one chapter each week of the brilliant book entitled "The God Story". Over the course of 12 weeks we will see how God's story is told from Genesis right through to Revelation and how that story can become part of our story. Each Sunday morning we will focus on the chapter which we have just read the preceding week.

These are just some ways in which we can prepare for the journey ahead. Please do consider taking up at least one of the above as we resume this journey once more on Ash Wednesday, 5th March. **Geoff**

Easter General Vestry Meeting

The Annual Easter General Vestry meeting will be held on Thursday 1st May at 8.00pm in the Cathedral Hall. Everyone is warmly and sincerely invited to attend but only those who are registered General Vestry members will be eligible to vote or indeed stand for election to office on the Select Vestry.

The Annual Easter Vestry Meeting includes an address from the Rector focusing on highlights from the past year. In addition, the audited Parish Accounts for the calendar year 2024 will be presented by the Honorary Treasurer for adoption. The Select Vestry have decided once more, in the interests of genuine transparency and to encourage deeper engagement, the audited accounts will be made available upon request to anyone who would like to have a copy in advance of the meeting. These accounts will be clearly marked as having been audited but not adopted and will be available from early April.

The business of the Annual Easter Vestry meeting also includes the appointment of a Rector's Churchwarden and Glebewarden and the election of a People's Churchwarden, Glebewarden and 12 members of the Select Vestry to serve the Church throughout the following year. When considering who to elect to serve in this way, parishioners should do so prayerfully and with due diligence as mission and ministry are enabled through the careful, prayerful allocation of parishioner's finances.

Pastoral care and all things regarding the spiritual development of all ages remains the responsibility of the clergy with the support of the Select Vestry.

Earlier in February I had the opportunity to join in with over 300 supporters of Tearfund for a Prayer Breakfast over Zoom. During that time we were able to pray for the work of Tearfund, heard from 2 of their staff working on the ground and Pete Greig spoke on the above Bible verse.

Pete spoke about how we are all conformed to this world one way or another, but that ultimately we as followers of Jesus need to transform the world we live in.

This verse (above) speaks about the renewal of our minds, about how we need to do what is good, acceptable and perfect in God's eyes.

How can we transform the world for our brothers and sisters who are suffering the most because of our choices? Can we transform the world for our children, their children and for generations to come that they will grow up in a world that they don't have to worry about the climate crisis? - Ask that our transformed lives will demonstrate God's love to others in practical ways.

- For true peace to come and last in conflicts zones.
- For Tearfund's vision to work with 250,000 churches to equip people to lift themselves out of poverty and fulfil their God given potential.
- For the provision of resources to see more churches transformed with alignment of hearts and minds in the global church.

A LOOK AT LIFE WITH THE RECYCLED TEENAGER- Compassion

Am I the only one who suffers from compassion fatigue? I'm not sure I should be sharing this as we are taught from a very young age that it is good to care about others, especially if they are less fortunate than ourselves. Basic Christianity 101, right?

For context, let me paint a scenario for you of what life was like 100 years ago. By the end of January 1925, Benito Mussolini has decided he'll be dictator of Italy, Trotsky and Stalin are battling it out for power in The Soviet Union and Adolf Hitler sets up a wee political party in Munich. Also there have been various sporting achievements, advances in technology and film releases. Not much has changed really on the face of it. The main change is in how we know about what is happening in the world.

One hundred years ago they read about the news in a daily newspaper, listened to a daily radio news programme and the only audio/visual representation was a weekly newsreel, shown before everyone settled down to enjoy Ben-Hur, in the pictures. Fast forward a hundred years, we can see the plight of our planet 24 hrs a day, up close, in person, in HD. Of course there are benefits to this as well as drawbacks (remember AI is coming). We have information as well as misinformation at our fingertips. We can see truth and fake news side by side. Will it ever end? What on earth are we to do? What would we pray for first?

I think this is my issue but it is actually God's. My instinct is to turn away and say, 'What can I do?' I only need to pray one prayer at a time. When I see pain and suffering in our world, He has seen it first and has the answer. I am not required to understand His ways but to demonstrate that I have His heart of compassion.

On a practical note, when I see something distressing on the news, I ask God what I should pray for and wait for His leading. We are not without hope. More


Praise, Prayer & Testimony





Bishops' Appeal and the Church of Ireland Youth Department (CIYD) have teamed up to encourage all Church of Ireland youth groups, youth clubs and schools to take part in *Pancakes and Prayer*, a special initiative for Lent 2025.

The focus will be on several schools in South Sudan within the Dioceses of Ibba and Maridi, all of which are part of the Fields of Life Thrive Programme which helps every child to say: "I am educated, I am fed, I am safe and I am loved."

Pray

We are asking young people and leaders throughout the Church of Ireland to pray throughout Lent for the students, teachers, and the wider communities of schools in South Sudan who are part of the Fields of Life Thrive programme.

Fundraise

We're also encouraging each group to run a special fundraising initiative at some point during this period — it could be a pancake party on or around Shrove Tuesday (4 March), or treats after church on Mothering Sunday (30 March), or simply to provide an opportunity for the young people to make a donation each time the group meets, in lieu of money they would normally spend on drinks or snacks.

Funds raised during Lent will go towards running school gardens, growing food to feed children during the school day. Training in growing and protecting crops, equipment and seedlings are all part of what will be provided through the generosity of young people within the Church of Ireland.

Many of us choose to give up something for Lent – be it sweets, fizzy drinks or crisps and snacks. The money we save, donated through Bishops' Appeal to the schools in South Sudan, will enable children in South Sudan to be fed day after day, week after week and month after month. Long after Lent ends the legacy will live on through the impact of our prayers and through our giving.

It costs a little over £8,000 per year (€10,000) to set up and maintain a school garden in a group of schools, feeding up to 3,500 children for a year at a cost of less than €3 per child or £2.50. **That's not per child per day, but per year!** This is a project where a small amount of money can make a big difference—and where our prayers for safety, welfare and the protection and presence of our loving God can and will transform lives.

Boost

Boost is our new Sunday morning Youth Ministry. We started on Sunday 2nd February with 16 young people gathered in The Base (Youth For Christ Centre). The vision behind Boost is to provide a space for our young people to go on a journey together exploring God's word and equipping them on how to live out the lives that God has called them to!
